Vacations in Waterford


Detroit was a bustling town where people lived and worked. In the summer a lot of people came north to Waterford, Michigan for their summer vacations. There were several reasons why they may have wanted to go there.

• Waterford is almost 400 feet higher than Detroit. Nearly all of the hills and lakes in Oakland County were formed during the retreat of the last continental glacier, approximately 14,000 years ago. During the retreat of the ice, an ice-free area formed between the Saginaw Lobe and the Huron-Erie Lobe which tracks through Commerce, Waterford, and Oxford. Waterford Township has a continental climate. It made the township cooler than towns south of there. (Air Conditioners were not able to be used in homes until 1947.)

DRAYTON PLAINS

• In 1851 the <u>Detroit, Grand Haven and Milwaukee</u> <u>Railway</u> came through Waterford Township and three train depots were built in Waterford. These were the Drayton Plains depot (at Hatchery Road), the Waterford depot (at Airport Rd.), and the

Windiate depot (at Windiate Rd.) . The railroad helped make the




many lakes easily accessible to summer vacationers from the big cities and served to make Waterford a summer resort area. In 1882, <u>Grand Trunk</u> <u>Western Railroad</u> purchased the railway.




- Waterford had 34 lakes and several places to stay.
- The Windiate Park Hotel was a summer resort for vacationers. The resort was easily accessed by four trains a day during the summer months from the 1890s to the 1940s and was located on Lotus



Lake, near the Windiate Cottage at Windiate Park depot. The resort featured boating, fishing, sailing, sunbathing, tennis and a dance hall.



The Waterford Hotel was also a popular resort in the village of Waterford. The hotel also served as a stagecoach for over 60 years.




- There was a Drayton Plains Hotel next to the depot and across from Loon Lake.
- Younds Beach at Elizabeth Lake Road included a picnic lawn, swimming, fishing, boating and bathing.



There was a Bathing Beach at Van Norman Lake Park. There were also Mitchell's Cabins at Van Norman Lake.

As roads were improved, people began driving to their summer resort area and the passenger depots were closed in the late 1950s.

People began to buy their own cabins to use in the summer in Waterford. Many people liked Waterford so much they fixed them up so they could live in them year round. Later subdivisions started up. People still seem to love living near the Waterford lakes!




