

? Where is Drayton Plains?



Drayton Plains was an unincorporated community in Oakland County. It was located on U.S. Highway 24 (Dixie Highway) around the west end of Loon Lake near Sashabaw Road. In 1872 Dixie Highway was called Saginaw Street. Mill Street became Hatchery Road.

In 1822 Jonathan Perry, Harvey and Austin Durfee settled at what became called Drayton Plains. At some point in that era Daniel Windiate built a grist mill. Mr. Windiate had been a miller in England, and his mill there was called the "Drayton Mill". When he built the new mill he named it for the mill from home, and from the surrounding plain itself. A dam and a gristmill were built in 1837. The Drayton Plains Hotel opened on Dixie Highway across from Sashabaw Road February 2, 1839. Mr. Whitfield and one or two others built a small cluster of houses, but no village lots were laid out until 1860 when the ground was platted.

A Fish Hatchery was in operation in Drayton Plains from 1901 to 1974. The Conservation Department shipped live fish raised at the Fish Hatchery by train to points throughout the state of Michigan. The Drayton Plains Nature Center is located where the Hatchery was. Several of the fish ponds can still be seen there.


In 1942 the Drayton Men's Club developed Drayton Ball Park, now called Shell Park.

Drayton Plains was informally referred to as a village and maintained its own identity and post office until the early 1990s when the post office was closed and functions transferred to the Waterford Post Office. Drayton Plains was never incorporated as a municipality and its identity has been largely subsumed within that of Waterford Charter Township.

Where is Clintonville?



Clintonville was an unincorporated community in Oakland County. It was located along the Clinton River on what is now Walton Boulevard between Clintonville Road and Sashabaw Road. Notice the road ended at the Clinton River on the map above. There was no bridge over the river at that time. The village was built on the shores of Wormer Lake and Schoolhouse Lake. Clintonville was never incorporated as a municipality.

Samuel Munson built a grist mill and saw mill in 1830 at Clintonville, just north of where the Clinton River meets Walton Boulevard. In the fall of 1835. Israel Osmun came to the place and in the spring of 1836 his brother, John Osmun, followed him. John Osmun, Sr. bought the mill property for his sons in the fall of 1835. They owned it until 1844 when they sold to Dr. George H. Williams who built a new mill.

Mr. Munson's house, the first one in the place, was a diminutive log structure. In 1833-34 he erected a small frame dwelling. The second house was built by General James Ten Eyck, a veteran of the war in 1812.

The first store was kept by Issac Osmun about 1840-42. The next was James Gow, a son-in-law of Dr. Williams. Gow and William Stiff operated the mill for several years. The first blacksmith shop was opened by Frederick Barkman as early as 1838-39. Edward Millholland started the first shoe shop. William Drewatt was proprietor of the first wagon shop. In 1838 a cabinet shop was established by Dodge & Sheldon. James Swartz built a hotel in 1838-39 and carried it on a number of years. It was no longer there in 1877. Several people either sold their business and/or left town.

Several years before the village was regularly laid out, the ground was divided into small lots and built on. The place had a small population and but little business from the mills. In 1847 the site was surveyed and platted. Clintonville land tract owners in 1872 include: John Linderman, Marcus Riker, W. Walker, John Van Campen, J. Bogardus, Mrs. Stuart, B. Greening, and J. Greening.

Clintonville had a post office from 1898 until 1902. Clintonville School No. 7 was the first in Clintonville. It was built on the banks of Schoolhouse Lake on what today is 3101 Walton Blvd. near Clintonville Road. The building still stands today. There is still a little bit of a street named Main Street under the water tower on Walton Boulevard near Clintonville Road. Whether it is a remnant of the Village of Clintonville is not certain. However, the township's GIS Interactive map's viewer shows the words Clintonville and Main Street almost on top of each other on the map near Lakeshore Drive on Walton Blvd.
